Last week has seen parts of East Timor devastated by severe flooding.

Forty minutes east of Dili is the village of Hera where Kid's Ark NGO volunteer directors Soraya Nepomuceno and Branca Lopes have been living and working for over 17 years. Their home has been struck with catastrophic flooding, reaching ceiling level in some parts, along with the NGO disability centre next door. Taupo Baptist Church has been supporting Kid's Ark in East Timor for 17 years, working with the poorer and disadvantage in the fields of Education, Health, Disabilities, Sanitation and water reticulation.

Several church members and teams have been to Hera and assisted with the projects over the years so its with sadness that we see what this major weather hit has done.

'Our exciting news is that God willing we will go back to Lusaka Zambia in June this year.

Our hearts are delighted by this opportunity to return after what has felt like a rather long wait!

Lusaka

Lusaka is the capitol of Zambia, of 4 million locals. The main languages of Lusaka are Nyanja and English, although many tribal languages are spoken in homes. Lusaka has some good medical centres, gluten free supplies and a great expat home-schooling community for our girls.

What will we be doing?

Our ministry focus in Lusaka will be discipleship - at the university in Lusaka. Young adults from all over Zambia make their way to the University, having spent an incredible amount of time and money preparing. There is a huge amount of pressure on these students to succeed, as well as peer pressure with new found freedom in a big city.

Our Role

Our role would be to focus on discipleship and discipleship training at the University. The goal is to help with weekly campus Bible studies and then follow up with one-on-one discipleship, as well as to train locals to do the same, working with the local church.'
