Here are two examples of why we need to be robust and well informed.

Last week, in the news, was a person who had been hired by two high profile organisations who had not followed police vetting recommended protocol, as TBC does. If they had they would have been alerted to the dangers they exposed their young people to.

Last week, I had reason to dial 111 for an urgent, serious situation outside TBC, and could immediately say what the address was without thinking about it—141 Rifle Range Road. Would you know it? Or where our first aid kit is?

New Updated Information Handbook

Taupo LifeKeys Trust Update

Taupo LifeKeys Trust has two main focus areas at present:

1) Christians against Poverty (CAP) which includes tailored help for people who are struggling to live day-to-day because of debt, and Release groups that help people who are struggling with addictive habits and behaviours.

2) Provide governance support for Te Haahi, as they establish a network of national victim support organisations that helps those who have been victims of family harm and it's wider implications. Volunteers are a first response to families referred by local police, where there has been low level trauma in the homes. Their aim is to provide support and practical assistance to these families.

The Trust is also being led into looking more closely at the current housing issues in Taupo, both for the vulnerable and for low income families and individuals.

Please continue to pray for the work being undertaken by the Trustees; that The Lord continues to use His church to make a positive difference in Taupo.

With massive unemployment and little or no social welfare systems in place, thousands of families are struggling to feed their families let alone cover rents, etc. Maala and I are so grateful to our beloved "Philippus" supporters in Germany who have responded to our appeal for our Palestinian neighbors, with tens of thousands of Euros. These monies will literally put food on the table for so many.
