The Covid-19 virus stopped us distributing the NZBMS self-denial receptacle this year, but we have them **available now**. Each one is hand made. The Receptacle is a small bamboo basket that has been hand woven by older villagers in Thailand. Bamboo baskets are a very common sight in everyday village life and serve as a multipurpose container. Larger baskets are often used to bring groceries home from the market, as lunchboxes for those working in the rice paddies, and as baskets for freshly-picked vegetables from the garden, or mushrooms from the forest. We hope you love your bamboo basket just as much as we do! We encourage you to place it somewhere that will remind you to pray for those in the village who have woven it together, and for those across Asia who are yet to know the love and grace of Jesus Christ.

Bangladesh FD6 application
