"Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." (John 7:37b-38).

Jesus said these words to a crowd of people over 2000 years ago; and they are as relevant to us today as they were back then. God the Holy Spirit wants to be that "river of living water" flowing from within us. He desires that we be full time 'River Dwellers', living in the flow of the Lord's presence and power.

Going up the mountain it took them 12 hours to get there, when it usually takes 2 hours. They were able to meet the students and have a few hours of activities and encouragement. But coming home again, they were back into a traffic jams with no movement either way.

Finally, Gary was able to take an alternative route through dirt roads, where he got lost 12 times, until he finally arrived home in the middle of the night with a car full of family all asleep. It took 10 hours to do the journey. They had no food or drink for the journey, and they were cold and tired.
