## Listening to God

**James 4:8 - Draw near to God and He will draw near to you.**

We can assume that God longs to talk with us, so how do we listen to God?

Draw aside to a quiet place without distractions.

Still our hearts and our thoughts.

Offer up thoughts of thanksgiving praise and worship.

Be still – don't be afraid of silence.

Pay attention in our hearts for His voice.

Wait for God to speak & write down His response - words & impressions.

Spend time with Godly people who also listen to God & learn from them.

Sometimes we doubt if we are hearing clearly and sometimes we get it wrong.

Our thoughts can be soulish or come from our wounded psyches.

Wrong choices will lead us further & further from relationship with Him.

Always be careful that what we're hearing lines up with scriptural principles.

All significant journeys require effort: we will make mistakes while learning.

**George Mueller** was a godly man who ran an orphanage and heard clearly from God. He said "*seek to get your heart in such a state that it has no will of its own with regard to the matter - don't predetermine what God's will is.*"

Too often we are wanting God to rubber stamp our plans and ideas.

If this is the case then our soulish thoughts will trump the voice of God.

God can do abundantly more than we ask or think if we seek His kingdom first.

Try not to be anxious about our personal wants but simply trust in Him.

The Holy Spirit journeys with us and as we obey Him, the clarity of his voice and anointing increases.

**Student Sponsorship**

For over 30 years, NZ Baptists have been supporting children from remote village communities and marginalised ethnic groups, in the form of student sponsorship. As part of this programme, children reside in Christian hostels where they are provided meals, clothing, healthcare, stationery and most importantly an excellent education. Financial contributions to this programme not only support all that is offered to the student, but also covers the cost of the hostel staff's wages, and maintenance of the hostel itself.

In partnership with the Bangladesh Baptist Church Fellowship and Tripura Baptist Christian Union, NZBMS sponsors currently support students across five hostels:

Telegu Hostel in Sylhet, Bangladesh  
Mymensingh Hostel in Bangladesh  
John Takle Hostel in Brahmanbaria, Bangladesh  
St Paul's Hostel in Agartala, Tripura  
Feni Hostel in Feni, Bangladesh

Due to the pandemic, schools have been closed and students have returned to their villages for their own health and safety. Families are being sent 1000 taka a month to cover expenses while they are away from the programme.

Currently sponsors contribute \$50 a month to the programme. While we are extremely grateful for these contributions, unfortunately due to rising costs, this is no longer enough to cover expenses.

For this reason, we are now offering Hostel Sponsorships for our Bangladesh hostels. Hostel sponsors will contribute to the costs the hostel as a whole; covering any shortfall in the costs of expenses. Sponsors do not need to write letters, and will receive an update from our Sponsorship Coordinators twice a year.
